



Dear Friends—

In this week's Gospel reading, Jesus says some of the most consoling words in all of Scripture: "I will not leave you orphans." Jesus is talking about his continued presence with the faithful through the Holy Spirit that he pours forth into our hearts. However, in this month of May, it is hard not to think of a different way we are not spiritual orphans: through the love of our mother Mary, to whom this month is dedicated.

On the cross, Jesus entrusted his mother to his beloved disciple John, saying, "behold your mother." In entrusting his mother to his beloved disciple. Jesus in a sense entrusted her to all his disciples. And indeed, from the earliest centuries of Christianity, the faithful have turned to Mary as mother time and time again. If you consider times of particularly intense devotion to Mary throughout history, one pattern that emerges is that the faithful turn to her especially in times of challenge or crisis. And this makes sense: When a child falls and skins a knee, or accidentally breaks a favorite toy, who do they most naturally turn to for consolation? They run to their mother's arms.

One prayer in particular has emerged over the centuries as a particularly powerful one for

those who long run into mother Mary's arms: the prayer known as the *Memorare (mem-or-AR-ay) from* its first word in the original Latin.

The Memorare dates to the 1400s, but became popular in the 1600s when the "mood" of Christianity had become rather dark. The theological debates of the 1500s had focused on the idea of predestination, and Protestant Reformers like John Calvin had begun to teach that we are all predestined from our births to either eternal salvation or eternal damnation. The result of the focus on predestination was that many Christians, both Protestant and Catholic, began to think of God not as a loving Father but as a terrible iudge waiting to condemn them for eternity. For many, the Memorare was a way to help recover faith in the merciful, loving God at the heart of Jesus' preaching. St. Francis de Sales (1567–1622), to give

one example, credited Mary for bringing him out of fear and despair, and in thanksgiving prayed the Memorare daily throughout his life.

The Memorare's popularity is due most, however, to the activities of Fr. Claude Bernard (1588–1641), who vigorously promoted the use of this prayer during his life. He credited Mary's intercession for miraculously curing him of severe illness after

praying the Memorare, and devoted his life to teaching it to others, especially the poor and imprisoned.

Ever since Fr. Claude Bernard's day, the Memorare has been a devotional resource for Catholics around the world. In recent times, Mother Teresa famously prayed the Memorare regularly for those in desperate circumstances. In fact, she developed a devotion called the "Flying Novena" which consisted of praying 10 Memorares not over nine days (as with a usual novena) but all in a row—a nine-prayer "novena" with a tenth prayer of thanksgiving in advance. There are many stories of Mother Teresa offering one of these Flying Novenas and having her petition granted right away. The Missionaries of Charity continue to use it in their communities to

this day ... It might be something worth trying.

You may already be very familiar with the Memorare, or perhaps you have never prayed it in your life. But during this month of May, I would invite us all to offer at least one Memorare for our parish community and our country. We live in a time where many faithful people are being tempted to think that God is leaving us as orphans. It can seem that God is withdrawing from the world around us and leaving it to become ever more crazy and violent. And so it is important to continue to turn to Jesus and to our mother Mary for the comfort and confidence that they will undoubtedly give.

Becoming our Best Selves One Step at a Time

Eleanor Roosevelt once said, "Beautiful young people are accidents of nature. Beautiful old people are works of art." Sounds like something only an angry old person would say, doesn't it? But Eleanor was much too wise and fair-minded to mean something like that. I suspect the beauty she was talking about was not purely physical, but was the total person, and that she meant something like this:

Beautiful young people are as yet unscarred by life, physically or emotionally. They are ambitious, optimistic, and self-assured. They tend to be highly critical of the present state of the world. But many are idealistic and eager to rebuild that world according to standards of justice. They dream and they <u>do</u>. Steps between those two are sometimes forgotten. They push the envelope, often forcing much needed action by sleepwalking "leaders." These are not the brash, the unthinking, or the uncaring.

Beautiful old people may bear little outward similarity to the young. The original physical beauty may be obscured by the wrinkles of time, but also enhanced by eyes that recognize the essence of the people they see, by their acceptance of differing points of view, by treating others with kindness and respect, and sharing with those who want them the life lessons they've learned. These are not the folks who feel that the words "young" and "bad" are synonyms.

Eleanor definitely was one of those beautiful old people, sculpted that way by the artist known as Life.

Why Do We Do That?

Ever wonder what the words, gestures, and rituals of Mass are all about? Keep an eye on this space each week! This week's question:

Q. Why do we say "Thanks be to God" after the first and second readings?

A. At the end of the first and second readings, the lector says "The Word of the Lord." One theologian has noted that this announcement is like a great shout or trumpet call, reminding us how marvelous




it is for us human beings to hear God speak to us through the Scriptures: "The declaration should be heard with absolute amazement. How absurd it would be to take for granted that God should speak in our midst. We are expressing our amazement, and we are saying that we do not take it for granted when we cry out from the depths of our hearts, 'Thanks be to God.'"

Thanksgiving is gratitude to God for his goodness and his acts in history. It is a common facet of worship in the Bible from the Old Testament to the New. The specific words, "Thanks be to God," were used by St. Paul to thank the Lord for delivering him from sin and death (Rom 7:25, 1 Cor 15:57, 2 Cor 2:14). Since the whole of the Bible ultimately points to Christ's work of salvation, it is fitting that we respond to the Scriptures proclaimed in the liturgy with the same expression of gratitude St. Paul used in his joyful thanksgiving for Christ's victory on the cross: "Thanks be to God!"

Our response is then followed by a moment of silence as we sit in awe and adoration of the God who just spoke to us. Silence is part of the heavenly liturgy in the book of Revelation, and it gives us time to reflect on the words we just heard—to become like Mary who "kept all these things, pondering them in her heart" (Lk 2:18).
