

# **Rob**'servations

### Dear Friends-

At the very end of his Gospel, St. John observes that the topic of Jesus is inexhaustible: "There are also many other things that Jesus did, but if these were to be described individually, I do not think the whole world would contain the books that would be written" (Jn 21:25). John makes a good point—After 2000 years of Christianity, the amount of writing about Jesus is overwhelming. Just consider the most authoritative writings for our Catholic faith:

- The Bible has more than 780,000 words.
- The Catechism has 2865 paragraphs.
- The Code of Canon Law lists 1752 laws regulating the life and governance of the Church.
- The teachings of the Church councils take up 1135 pages.
- On top of all this, the writings of the saints, popes, and bishops would fill a library.

And all these writings are centered on Jesus, on knowing him and the way of life he opens to those who believe.

Now we should remember that we don't *have* to know everything that's in these writings. The most important thing, after all, is to know Jesus, not to know about him. But we can always know those we love better, learn about them more deeply. A number of times I've been struck by hearing my wife tell our children some anecdote about when she was a girl, and realize that I've never heard it before. Over 25 years after our first date, I still have things to learn about her! If I still don't know everything about the person I know best, my wife, how much more can I know about Jesus? All of us have a lot to learn about our faith.

I bring up all this today to let you know that our parish will be offering a great opportunity to delve more deeply into our Catholic faith, beginning at the end of this month on **October 25.** On **Wednesday evenings from 6:00–7:30 pm at St. Vincent School,** we will be meeting in one of the classrooms for the program *Symbolon*, a series of videos that go through all aspects of what Catholics believe and how we live. The meetings are at the same time as our Religious Education classes so that interested parents can conveniently attend. There is no cost for the program.

The *Symbolon* program offers clear presentations of what we believe, and also invites discussion about some of the challenging aspects of our faith: how to deal with suffering and loss, our differences with Protestant and other non-Catholic Christians, the relation between science and faith, and much more. This Fall the sessions will focus on Catholic faith, and in the Winter/ Spring the sessions will focus on Catholic living, especially the sacraments and moral teachings. At each meeting, we will focus on a single topic, so you can come for all the sessions or just the ones that fit your schedule.

We have used the Symbolon program for several years in the parish as the basis of our RCIA program. I haven't seen another program that is as clear, complete, engaging, and relevant as this one.

Going through the program with others will offer us all an opportunity to share our own experience with our faith and to learn about other's perspectives on their relationship with God. You might be a beginner—someone who's never been baptized, or was baptized in another Christian community, or a Catholic who's never had the time or resources to learn all aspects of our faith. Or you might be a lifelong, Confirmed Catholic who already has a lot of knowledge and is looking for more. Whoever you are, I encourage you to check out *Symbolon* in our parish this Fall!

No appointment is necessary, but having your form filled out ahead of time will be helpful!




God Is a Man of War: The Problem of Violence in the Old Testament



**2024 MASS INTENTIONS** 

We will begin taking Mass Intentions for the entire year of 2024 starting on **Monday, October 23.** Reminder of a couple of parish rules. We have a limit of 3 Masses per person per

calendar year. (Ex. 3 for Mom, 3 for Dad) We are unable to accept a Mass Intention under the heading of *special intention,* we need to have a name or reason for the Mass. We have set one Mass each weekend as a Collective Mass, if you wish to name 4 or more people in your intention it will need to be scheduled during one of the Collective Masses. The Collective Masses are offered at different times but they are preset and cannot be moved.


