





On October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi concluding the annual Season of

Creation, Pope Francis released "Laudate Deum" ("Praise God"), a new document intended to update his Encyclical Letter 'Laudato Si' on Care for Our Common Home.'

This latest apostolic exhortation by Pope Francis is an anguished cry for a worldwide response to the climate crisis and for global cooperation in addressing the issue. In it he warns "We're close to the breaking point." (LD #2) Laudate Deum is addressed to all people of goodwill and is composed of six chapters. In this text the pope criticizes climate change deniers and reviews the scientific data that supports the undeniable evidence of the climate crisis. All is done in light of our Christian faith and out of concern for the victims of environmental and climate injustice.

In his message for World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation (September 1, 2023) Pope Francis used the phrase "a senseless war against creation." The war against creation is one in which we all have knowingly and unknowingly taken part in. Perhaps Pope Francis has used this image of war on God's gift of creation as a way of reminding us that the results of war are death and destruction. Please pray for and advocate for the care of creation.




