

(Inspired by Matthew Kelly, an internationally known Catholic author and speaker. He is the author of Rediscover Catholicism and at least ten other books.)

Ego: Believing that either we have or we can get the knowledge and skills to accomplish something. Sometimes our ego misleads us. Young people run into this all the time when the dreams of childhood meet the realities of our abilities. In my late teens. two of my best friends were old guys - they were pushing 30 - and both were professional church musicians, like Randy. Though I had never had even one piano lesson, I decided that was the life for me. Accordingly, I began months of nightly trips to my parish church to practice on the organ. My brain learned how to decipher sheet music, but the sound of even my best efforts to turn this knowledge into skilled performance was pretty awful. I finally realized that my stubby fingers and very average fine motor skills wouldn't cut it. My dream crashed - I had failed. But I never regretted the effort. How else would I have learned? For young people - or old people, for that matter - failure is just as important to eventually becoming our best selves as success.




Mass of Remembrance


Holy Hour for Peace

Our Lady of Fatima Rosary Rally


