

You are sitting in the pews of one of the churches belonging to St. Jude the Apostle Parish, Oshkosh. Have you ever wondered who exactly St. Jude Thaddeus was? Each year on October 28 the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast Day of St. Jude Thaddeus. St. Jude is a mysterious figure in the fact that he moves in and out of the gospel story, quietly in the background, as if he didn't want to draw attention to himself. The Gospel does tell us that St. Jude Thaddeus was a follower of Jesus, one of the original twelve Apostles, and that he was the brother of St. James the Lesser (poor guy to have that name!). St's. Jude and James are sometimes called "brethren" of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew, probably cousins. Biblical scholars agree that St. Jude was a son of Clopas and his mother Mary was the Virgin Mary's cousin. Ancient writers tell us that he preached the Gospel in Judea, Samaria, Idumaea, Syria, Mesopotamia, and Lypia. According to Eusebius, he returned back to Jerusalem in the year 62 and assisted in the election of his brother, St. Simeon, as Bishop of Jerusalem. Poor St. Jude is sometimes confused with Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus, but they are two different people. St. Jude is known as the patron saint of hope and difficult causes.

Interesting information about St. Jude the Apostle:

*He is traditionally depicted carrying the image of Jesus in his hand. The story goes that King Abagar of Edessa asked Jesus to cure him of his leprosy by sending one of his artists to bring back an image of Jesus. Jesus pressed his face on a cloth, leaving the image of His face on it. Jesus then took the cloth, gave it St. Jude, and St. Jude took the image to King Abagar who was miraculously cured! This image is called the Image of Edessa.

*You typically see a flame on his head. This flame represents being present during Pentecost, when he accepted the Holy Spirit alongside the other apostles.

*He is the one who asked Jesus at the Last Supper why He would not manifest Himself to the whole world after His resurrection.

*His bones can be found in the left transept of St. Peter's Basilica under the main altar of St. Joseph in a tomb he shares with the remains of the Apostle Simon the Zealot.

*There is a Shrine to St. Jude in Chicago, Il that was founded in 1929 at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church.

*There is a Novena to St. Jude!







Why Do We Do That?

Ever wonder what the words, gestures, and rituals of Mass are all about? Keep an eye on this space each week! This week's question:

Q. Why do we celebrate All Saints' Day?

A.All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven.



Generally, All Saints' Day is a Holy Day of Obligation. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven.

Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints—that is, those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church.

All Saints' Day is also commemorated by members of the Eastern Orthodox Church as well as some Protestant churches, such as the Lutheran and Anglican churches.

All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in A.D. 609. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints.

The choice of the day may have been intended to co-opt the pagan holiday "Feast of the Lamures," a day which pagans used to placate the restless spirits of the dead.

The holy day was eventually established on November 1 by Pope Gregory III in the mid-eighth century as a day dedicated to the saints and their relics. The May 13 celebration was subsequently abandoned.


