PRAYER CHAIN REQUESTS

Rob'servations

Dear Friends-

Beginning next month, with the First Sunday in Advent, our parish community will be adding a couple prayers during our Masses: the *Anima Christi* and the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel. These beautiful, powerful prayers have been popular for a long time, and many of you probably already know or are at least familiar with one or both of them. The first, the Anima Christi, we will pray together after communion, after we have returned to our pews and had a few moments to privately thank God for the Body of Christ we have received. Especially during this year of the Eucharistic Revival, this beautiful prayer can help us open ourselves as a community to the graces God wants to give us through Holy Communion.

The Anima Christi has been around for awhile. The prayer's origins are obscure but seem to date to the 1300s. Famously, St. Ignatius of Loyola advises the use of this prayer several times in his *Spiritual Exercises* (1524). Because of this, the prayer came to be so closely associated with Jesuit spirituality that many people thought that St. Ignatius himself wrote it.

The second prayer, the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel, we will pray together at the end of Mass. In the Old Testament, the prophet Daniel identifies the archangel Michael as the unique spiritual guardian assigned by God to protect his people (Dan 12:1). The early Church adopted the Jewish tradition of venerating St. Michael as the community's special protector. The particular prayer that we will be using was written by Pope Leo XIII around A.D. 1880, as a response to a vision he had of demons attacking the city of Rome. From 1884 to 1965, the popes required

Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, save me. Blood of Christ, inebriate me. Water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me. O good Jesus, hear me. Within your wounds, hide me. Let me never be separated from you. From the wicked enemy, defend me. In the hour of my death, call me, And bid me come to you, That with your saints I may praise you Forever and ever. Amen. the St. Michael prayer and a few others to be said at the end of every Mass. Some of you might even remember this! When the requirement was lifted in 1965, some communities continued to pray the St. Michael prayer after Mass. It is often also said at the end of the rosary. In recent years, the practice of praying the St. Michael prayer after Mass has begun to be re-adopted by more and more communities. This is likely because the prayer's plea for spiritual protection is felt more deeply in spiritually troubled times, such as our own.

If you don't know these prayers, don't worry! The text of both will be included in a card in the back cover of the *Breaking Bread* books, and praying them regularly will help us to learn and memorize them. Memorizing prayers and passages of scripture can lead to us writing these words on our hearts, so that they become available to us when we need them. Pope Benedict XVI once wrote about the importance of learning the prayers of the Church: "Normally, thought precedes word ... But praying the Psalms and liturgical prayer in general is exactly the other way around: The word, the voice, goes ahead of us, and our mind must adapt to it. ... By praying together with the brothers and sisters [God] has given us, we gradually come to know him and draw closer to him."

May the *Anima Christi* and St. Michael Prayer help all of us draw closer to Jesus in our St. Jude Parish community!




