

PRAYER CHAIN REQUESTS

For we know neither the day nor the honr...



This weekend our country honors its Veterans. I'm honored to be related to, and have many close friends, that are United States Veterans. One thing we've always been told is that a soldier signs a check, payable with their *life*. They very resolutely say "Yes" to the call to defend their country. They don't know the day or the hour but they very willingly say "Yes" I am ready! Even in this willingness they do not know the day or the hour their check could be cashed.

Recently our surrounding community has experienced so many unexpected deaths. Three separate souls within eight days in the Omro community alone. These folks didn't wake up that morning knowing they would be leaving this earthly world. In the Holy Land, according to authorities on both sides, the latest violence has caused more than 1,400 deaths in Israel and at least 10,305 in Gaza as of Nov. 7! Most of these lives were not soldiers that willingly said "Yes" to sacrificing their lives. Horrifyingly, it is being estimated that nearly half of these casualties are children. They did not know the day or the hour but these souls have left this earthly world.

None of us know when our very own day or hour will come. That thought alone is terrifying but it's not where our thoughts should stop. As Christians, we know Jesus Christ stripped the terror from death by humbling himself and dying for us! His story didn't end. He didn't just die but rose again so that death has no victory over us. Before He died, Jesus gave us very important and very direct instructions on how to follow him. In today's gospel we hear from Jesus that we need to be ready and vigilant. Are we ready? Are we living the way Jesus instructed for us to live? Does He know us because we have a relationship with Him? Are we using our gifts and talents to serve Him through our care of His sons and daughters? Have we gone to confession and received the grace God gives us for all our shortcomings? Have we come to His altar and received His Body in the Eucharist? Are we taking time to thank Him for every gift in our life, even the gift of waking up one more day?

Have we taken the time to listen to God's calling in our own lives?

This weekend we have 19 children who are finding out first hand how our amazing Father in heaven forgives our sins. They have been learning with eagemess only youth possess. We shared a Sunday retreat learning about how healing Jesus is with the sacrament of Reconciliation. These young boys and girls are so alive and excited about their faith! This is a big step in them receiving Jesus in the Eucharist! Please pray for them as they journey in deepening their faith. Join them in growing closer to God. We have confession offered weekly on Saturdays at 3:30pm at St. Vincent Church. We celebrate the Mass daily and 4 different times between Saturday night and Sunday! Get involved, Jesus is calling and waiting for us to be ready! God is good, all the time!



Why Do We Do That?

Ever wonder what the words, gestures, and rituals of Mass are all about? Keep an eye on this space each week! This week's question:

Q. Why is the month of November dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory?

A. The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory, whose feast is celebrated on November 2. A **"Holy Soul" is someone who is now in Purgatory.** The use of "Holy" emphasizes the state of justice in which they died; the use of "Poor" their need for our



prayers, given the purification they are undergoing.

From the earliest days of the Church, Catholics have believed in a place of final purification for the faithful who died. Those who died a martyr were recognized as already with God, since they were perfectly conformed to Christ and His Cross by their martyrdom. For the many believers who never had the opportunity to give such a public witness, the Church offered prayers, especially the Mass, that, purified from every imperfection, they would enter into Heaven. Many ancient texts, as well as catacombs and tombs, bear witness to this belief. In the Middle Ages the name "Purgatory" began to be used, since it aptly describes the belief of the Church from the beginning up until today.

While the word "Purgatory" does not appear in Scripture, the possibility of purification after death certainly does in the Old Testament (2 Macc. 12:39-45). In the New Testament, **Jesus and St. Paul state that we need to be purified of all our sins before we can enter the joy of heaven** (Mt 5:24-25, 1 Cor 3:11-15).

We can help the Holy Souls by having Masses said for them, including them in our daily prayers and Rosary intentions, and praying for them when we're near a cemetery. In particular, we can pray the "Eternal rest" prayer for one or many people: "Eternal rest, grant unto him/her/them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him/ her/them. May he/she/they rest in peace."

The Parish Cookbook will be available soon!




