
COOKING MATTERS

Eating is an agricultural act ending the food circle that begins with sowing and reaping. City people can participate in this act as more than just consumers. We can eat responsibly. We can participate in food production by growing something to eat, be it a vegetable garden or just a pot in a sunny window. If possible, we can deal directly with local farmers by purchasing their produce at our downtown markets, and we can prepare our own food.

Home cooking not only gives us a meal but also the occasion; the habit of eating together at a certain time and place. Meals together bring back nostalgic memories of Sunday dinners at Grama and Grampa's house, the smells, the conversations, and the sociality among families. Over time that has evolved into more outdoor cooking on a grill and almost becoming a form of weekend recreation. Cooking skills have gradually been lost.

Mass food preparation has cut down on the time it takes to make a meal, and it was found that when we don't have to cook meals, we eat more of them! One interesting study found that poor women who routinely cooked were more likely to eat a more healthy diet than well-to-do women who didn't. Can a culture of everyday cooking be rebuilt? We already have takeout meals from the supermarket; is a drive-through supermarket next? Cooking matters a lot.
