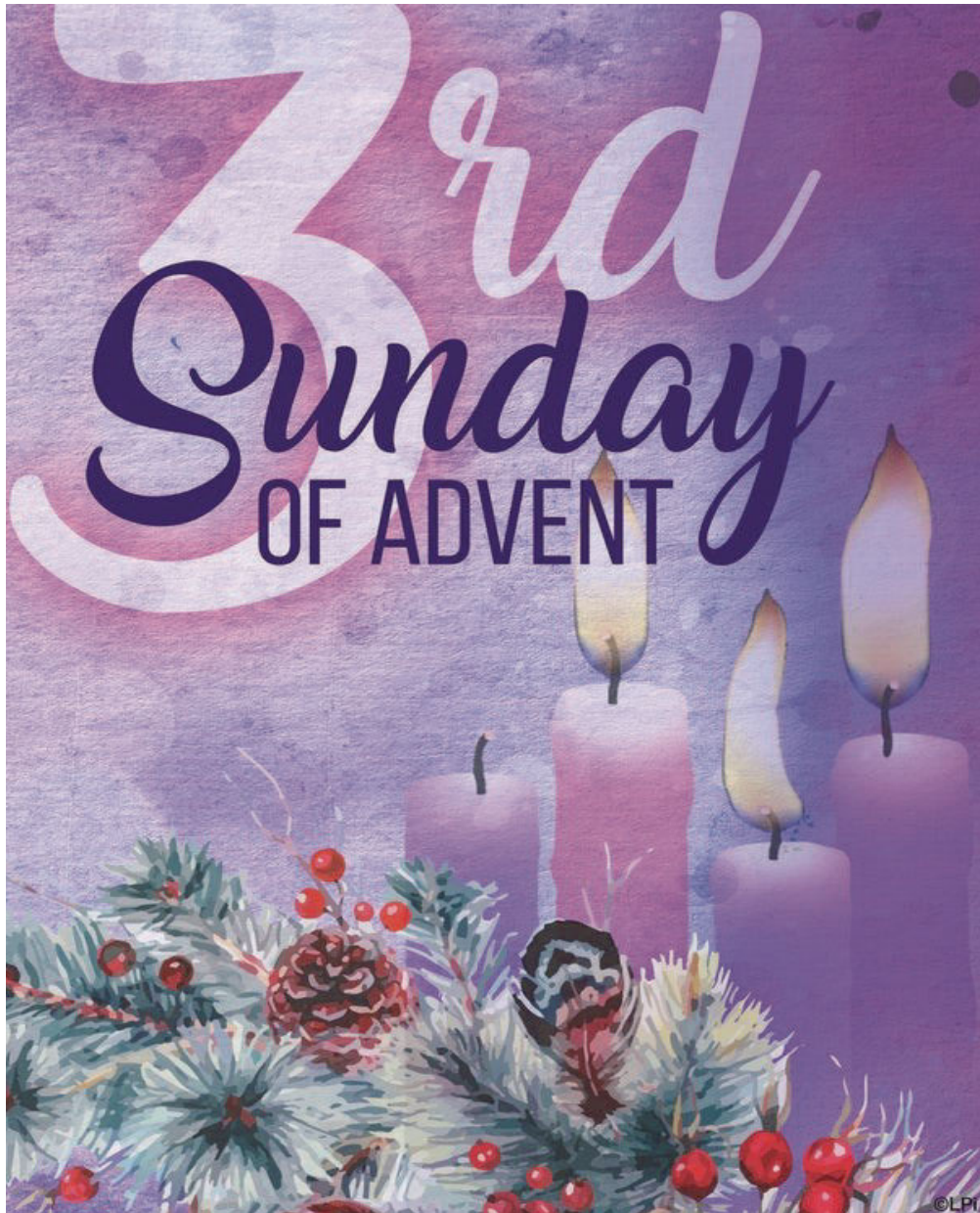

Remember on that First Sunday of Advent when the word “**watch**” was used four times? Christmas is just around the corner, have you taken time to come to God in prayer and converse with Him? Have you been careful to not get caught up in the hustle and bustle of life? With Advent only being three weeks and one day this year we haven’t had much time to prepare for the baby Jesus, coming soon, into our lives!

The first two words of the second reading are so very powerful this weekend. *Rejoice always*. Notice that St. Paul doesn’t suggest that we should rejoice, it is a statement. As we close up this short season of Advent my prayer is that we all devote more time to talking with God in prayer, spending less time running through our days trying to create the perfect Christmas dinner and party, and to find joy in the small things.

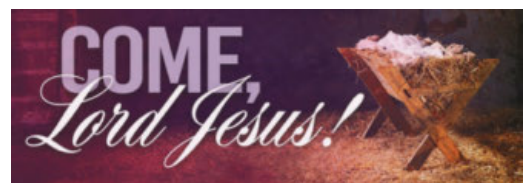

Care for Creation!



Mind the Wrap is a campaign to reduce single-use wrapping paper waste. There is nothing wrong with wrapping gifts- it is part of a tradition of celebration and generosity. The issue is with what we use to wrap. Problem is, most gift wrapping paper cannot be recycled because it is mixed with materials such as plastic, glitter, dye, ink, laminate, foil and sticky tape etc. The same can be true for gift bags and bows. All is destined for the landfill. Why not give back to our planet this year and forgo all the flashy gift-wrapping, opting instead for more sustainable and eco-friendly gift wrapping options. Here are some creative alternatives to store bought wrapping paper:

Use old maps, magazines, newspapers, calendars, colorful fabric, tea towels, scarves, pillow cases, tote bags, and children's art work (with their permission). Tins, jars, baskets, and recycled boxes can be used. Also, use leaves, pine cones, berries, branches, twine, and fabric strips instead of ribbons and bows. While we are at it why not reduce consumption, because consumption and waste go hand in hand. Think outside the (material box) and gift an experience. For instance, tickets to a movie, concert, or play. Give a gift made with intention. This can be a letter, drawing, plant cutting, cake or soup ready-to-use mixes are some ideas. Lastly, for the person who has everything, make a charitable donation in their name.

Why Do We Do That?

Ever wonder what the words, gestures, and rituals of Mass are all about? Keep an eye on this space each week! This week's question:

Q. Why do we have to go to Mass twice on December 23-25?

A. This year, December 24 is a Sunday, meaning that we will celebrate **the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the Christmas Eve vigil Masses on the same day.** As Catholics, we are **obliged to attend Mass every Sunday and holy day of obligation,**



unless there is some grave reason preventing us (such as illness). (If you've missed Mass any Sunday or holy day, be sure to mention it the next time you go to confession!) When a holy day of obligation—such as All Saints' Day or the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception—falls on a Saturday or Monday, the bishops of the United States generally lift the obligation. **The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday, however, is never lifted. The same goes for the obligation to attend Mass on Christmas.** That means that, whether you attend the Saturday vigil Mass and a Monday Christmas Mass, or attend Mass twice on Sunday, or go to Mass on Sunday and Monday mornings, this Christmas we will all be going to church a little more frequently than we're used to.

The Church urges us to consider this obligation not as a nuisance but as an invitation: In his letter on the Sunday obligation, *Dies Domini*, Pope St. John Paul II beautifully wrote, **"Do not be afraid to give your time to Christ! ... Time given to Christ is never time lost, but is rather time gained,** so that our relationships and indeed our whole life may become more profoundly human."
