It was a typical Saturday or Sunday, so the Catholics of Oshkosh go to church:

Some of us are sleepy, some are just tired from a busy week of work. Some of us are not in the best of moods as we approach the church, maybe it's the kids? But actually, most of us go to church because it is our habit to do so. It is expected of us!

Well, this particular weekend experience in church was a little different from the structured Mass that we are all accustomed to attending. This weekend, we had some kind of a guest speaker. But when he started to preach, or should I say "teach", there was something very dynamic in the way he spoke. The man spoke with such "authority" and knowledge. It was that his ideas, shall we say, were fresh and contemporary. Rather, there was just something in his very presence that made vou "sit straight"! This man had authority. The man and his message about God's Kingdom were one and the same thing. This man packed a "wallop" just by just being there, his mere presence. Did you hear the people in the next pew whisper? Did you see the teenager sitting next to my wife, write the word "Great" on his bulletin?

Suddenly, on the other side of the church, a troubled man "cried out" and questioned the guest speaker and asked if he is here to destroy the church or just interfere. But, the guest speaker merely fought back, verbally, and told the troubled man that all will be right, if you follow His word! After this jaw dropping incident, the congregation did not know or did not realize what had just happened. Wow! No one is ever going to forget this mass. From that point on, everyone became very attentive. No one's mind wandered. Just who was that great speaker that could change a person's life?

The "actual" story that you have just read may sound familiar because you just heard this as today's Gospel reading. The people of Oshkosh going to church is the same as the Jews of Capernaum going to the synagogue on the Sabbath. The people feeling "lax" to go to church is the same in both stories. The fact of a guest speaker is the same for both stories. But, in today's Gospel, the exceptional quest speaker is really Jesus and the troubled man from our story was actually a person who was possessed by an evil spirit. And as we all know, Jesus would be the "one" to remove evil spirits from a person. Yet, both stories show amazement! Amazement in the way the guest speaker (Jesus) preached and in the way the guest speaker (Jesus) removed a demon from a person. Yes, Jesus taught with real authority! We are and should always be amazed with the method that Jesus chose to teach and heal. In every sense of the word, Jesus is awesome!

We are the Church, the Body of Christ, which by definition means that we spiritually possess the Holy Spirit of God. Our lives are to speak the Word of God and to be delivered from sin. Christ calls all of us to minister in His authority. Every week that you come to church, just listen very carefully to the words of the speaker, those are the words from Christ!
