



BAPTISM

Baptisms are celebrated at the Saturday, 4:30 pm Mass and the Sunday, 11:00 am Mass, most weekends. (We do not have Baptisms during the season of Lent.)

A pre-baptismal class is required for all parents. Baptism preparation classes are held on the second Tuesday of the month for 1st time parents and on the third

Tuesday of the month for parents baptizing their second, third...child. Class must be completed 4-6 weeks before the date of the baptism.

Parents are welcome to take the class before their baby is born also. Call the parish office for available dates and to register.

Do you know what a Transformer is? Well if you ask anyone under 30 they will tell you it was, and still is, the greatest of toys. I

remember my
grandsons wanting
every kind there
was. What starts
out as a very
ordinary man, with

manipulations by a

youngster, transforms into a Super Hero of unimaginable powers and strength. As the dutiful Grandma, I would appear amazed by this transformation.

Well, today's readings are also meant to amaze and make us awestruck, as Jesus Transforms from the very human, Rabi and friend of his disciples into a Divine, glorious redeemer right before their eyes. How awestruck they must have been to witness this!

This witnessing of the Transformation did not come easily though. First they had to climb Mt. Hernon—not an easy feat as this Mt. is 9,200 feet high! In our lives we too have mountains to climb. All through time there have been mountains to climb. Abraham had Mt Moriah (elevation 4,049') where the biggest of Abraham's mountains was the fact

he would be asked to sacrifice his only son! Moses had Mt. Sinai, but his biggest mt. was getting the Jewish slaves he had freed to keep their faith in God. Then there is Elijah who had Mt. Carmel (1,725") and Mt. Horeb (1,243") but whose biggest hurdles were too numerous to name. From facing idolatry, confronting Ahab and Jezebel, depression and fear and the list goes on, but Elijah climbed his mountains and received the glory of God.

We will all have mountains to climb. Some may be just big hills like Mt Tabor (1,000') While others may be like Mt Everest . These mountains will present as illness, death, loss of a job, beginning a new job, passing a test, being betrayed by a loved one, etc, etc, etc. Life will be full of these "mountains". No matter how hard they are to climb, when we reach the top; when we have let the Holy Spirit guide us—Oh what a beautiful transformation it is to see that God has worked wonders, by brining us over and through that mountain!

Let this Lent be a time of transformation for all us. Let the Holy Spirit be our guide. Let our faith strengthen us to climb whatever mountain we may be faced with. Then at the end of our Lenten journey, we too will be awestruck and able to revel in the love, forgiveness, hope, faith and glory that our God has in store for us come Easter morning!


Grief Support Group







Our Goals—Three Pillars of Lent




SPRING BOOK DISCUSSION
