

Turbulence in the Temple

In today's Gospel, John 2:13-25, we find Jesus with his disciples at the temple in Jerusalem during the time of the Passover. And inside the temple, a place of worship, Jesus finds stalls where oxen, sheep and birds are being sold for sacrifice. He also found money changers sitting at their tables exchanging coins for different amounts. Instead of hearing sounds of praise and worship, Jesus heard the ringing of coins being poured out, the cry of sheep, the mooing of cattle and the sound of people haggling over prices. The sounds combined made such a noise that worshippers in the temple had a difficult time praying. discovers this commotion is not coming from the "outside" walls of the temple, but rather the "inside" walls of the temple where the chief priests had moved all this action, so they could make money from all the transactions made.


Now, we find out where the capital "T" in the word turbulence comes from! Jesus makes a whip out of some chords and drives all the animal sellers and money changers out of the temple. Can you imagine the chaos that was caused with all the sheep and oxen rushing out of the temple and people shouting and scurrying everywhere to pick up their coins that fell to the ground. You will notice that Jesus did "this" single-handedly, with no help from anyone, and yet no one attempted to stop him or arrest him? God's house must never be made a house of merchandise. The chief priests defended the sale of animals and currency in the temple itself. This had become a convenient way to make money for the temple. And this is when Jesus claimed the right to "purify" the purifying temple. He is his Father's This is exactly what the Messiah would do. Yet, they dispute his right to take action.

The doubting Jews ask Jesus for a sign of his right for his actions. Jesus says, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews bluntly replied that it took forty-six years to build the temple and Jesus would raise it up in three days? But what temple is Jesus talking about? When Jesus said, this "temple," he meant his own body. As Messiah, Jesus had come as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. He had come to be the Passover Lamb. He had come to die on the cross for your sins and mine. He will prove that he was the Messiah by dying and rising again!

As God's beloved son, Jesus would naturally love his Father's house and must be concerned about its use or abuse. And since we are God's children, we should be just as concerned about our Father's house as Jesus was. Repent and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and follow Jesus every day. You must put your trust in Jesus. Let Jesus cleanse vour temple, your heart, and mind. Jesus calls on you to receive him as Lord Savior. and Jesus will vour provide abundant life and will do that through his death and resurrection. The temple of his body will be destroyed and then raised on the third day. As a result, Jesus is the new temple where anyone and everyone can do business with God and find life! How is your Lenten Journey coming? You know that there is going to be "Joy In The Morning" soon!

Safe Water Scarcity

This moming, I made my self a cup of coffee using filtered water. While heading to the shower I reminded my self to start the dishwasher before leaving for the day. There is always laundry to do, so I thought that would be a good afternoon task, and if I still had energy I would clean the bathroom. Ugh! Oh yes, dinner...maybe a healthy garden salad. Except I really dislike having to wash....

By now you know where I am heading with this. Please consider the following fast facts about the scarcity of safe water supplies worldwide.

- *780 million people lack basic drinking water access.
- *1.6 million people die annually from consuming polluted water
- *2.3 billion people live without access to basic sanitation.
- *40% of the worlds' population carries their water from wells.

To highlight this last statistic you should know that it is women and girls who bear the responsibility of hauling water from distant wells and streams, not once, but multiple times a day. There are no latrines along the way and sadly young girls are often attacked on their early morning and late night journey's. Attending school and keeping up with homework is near impossible because there just isn't enough time for them to do so.

Some claim that the world water crisis is one of the largest public health issues of our time. There are organizations like Cross Catholic trying to address this complex issue in whatever way that they are able. We too can participate this Lent by supporting Wells of Salvation with a monetary donation. Thank you!




SPRING BOOK DISCUSSION

Lent is the Church's primary penitential season.




