## SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

## PASTORAL VISITS

Care Ministers are available for Pastoral Visits, if you or a loved one are in need of a listening presence or spiritual companionship. We can also bring Holy Communion to anyone who cannot get to Mass. Please let us know if you are homebound or have recently moved into a care facility so that we may continue to meet your ministerial needs.

 Here we are, *Laetare Sunday*, the fourth Sunday of Lent! Laetare is a Latin word that means "rejoice." Isn't it weird that we are rejoicing during the season of Lent? A period that is known to be penitential and not necessarily a time of joy. Traditionally, Sundays are named after the first word of the liturgy's opening antiphon. On this Sunday, the antiphon is taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied ... " (Isaiah 66:10-11). Even while we continue to observe Lenten sacrifices. we rejoice our in anticipation of the joy that will be ours at Easter!

If we reflect to the end of Gospel from last week, we heard that "Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well." (John 2:24-25) These people who were in temple began to believe only when Jesus showed them signs – but where were they when Jesus was nailed to the cross? Nowhere to be found. Did the signs he showed them seem less real as he walked his passion? Even then Jesus understood well about human nature. He knew because he took flesh and dwelt among us. He understood that we sometimes fail, sometimes lack the fortitude to carry through on our commitments or responsibilities, that we are not perfect. They were scared for what was transpiring and worried for their lives. Can we blame them?

When we contemplate why he suffered for us we read that Jesus said;" For God so loved the world that gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16). We see this verse time and time again on bumper stickers, signs at sporting events, places where we would never think we would see it. Why is that? It is because this very verse teaches us that out of the darkness a light shines. A glimmer of hope in our fallen state, and the opportunity to reach our highest hopes of eternal life. This God who brought the people out of the slavery of Egypt will continue to bring us closer to himself even when we feel that the darkness around ourselves is just too dark for him to see. Praise God that he continually comes to find us!

We hear throughout the year all the ways that Jesus spoke to how much we are loved by the Father. One in particular speaks to the awesome love, when Abraham pleaded with God to spare the people of Sodom "...suppose there were fifty righteous people... forty-five... forty... Do not let my Lord be angry if I go on... thirty... twenty... Please, do not let my Lord be angry if I speak up this last time... What if ten are found there?" (Gen 18:24-33).

The beauty of our God is that even though we do not deserve his love he continually seeks us out. Time and again we read in the bible that he loves us so much that he gives us the gifts of mercy and grace. How often do we share these gifts with others? How often do we forgive someone who has wronged us, or allow mercy to rule how we treat others? As Christians, we should always strive to show the very love we are shown. It is not always easy but it is expected. Rejoice with someone you might have lost touch. Perhaps it may even be with God himself.




