

BAPTISM

Tuesday of the month for parents baptizing their second, third...child. Class must be completed 4-6 weeks before the date of the baptism.

Bertie's Bits

"I'LL BELIEVE IT WHEN I SEE IT" or "I'LL SEE IT WHEN I BELIEVE IT"

It is now a whole New World! We have gone through 40 days (about 1 and a half months) of Lent, the 3 days of the Holy Triduum and the Glory of Easter-- so now what? Now comes the best part! No longer are we in a world of wondering, but a world of **Wonderment**! Through his **human** self-Jesus showed us what he expects from those who follow him. He showed us to care for the poor, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, tend to the ill and comfort those who mourn. Easy right? WRONG! He never said it would be easy. We know we must put in the effort, but then? Now the fulfillment of all that has been promised has occurred. Now he is teaching through his **DIVINE** self, the main message which is Love and Forgiveness." He suffered, died, and was buried, all for our sins and to show us He will be with us through all the difficulties, joys, and sufferings we will encounter on life's journey. His rising gave proof to the Father's love and forgiveness. Was this forgiveness something we earned or deserved? Probably not, but that does not matter. We are forgiven. It is our legacy.

When Jesus first appeared to the women at the tomb their testimony was not believed. Later the testimony of Peter and the Beloved Disciple was likewise met with disbelief. Then Jesus' appearance in the upper room to all (except Thomas, who was missing), was met with amazement, bewilderment and I would imagine a bit of fear. His rising and the healing from all his earthly suffering was a testament to how we will be healed and brought to eternal life once we have accepted His teachings and received the Holy Spirit. Do we truly believe this? Is our faith strong enough? Perhaps we are like Thomas, and require more proof? In today's world we seem more like Thomas than ever. We live in a world that says, "you can't" more often than it says "yes you can." We are lied to so often that we feel we must "fact check" everything we hear or see. We are scammed all the time and our phones are full of spam calls. We feel we must become a "doubting Thomas" just so as not to be taken advantage of! Yet Jesus says "Blessed are they that believe without seeing". That is because Jesus is talking about our eternal life. Our

"legacy" of love and forgiveness bestowed on us by our heavenly Father. Jesus is speaking of a world of "yes you can!' We may never in our earthly life get to see Jesus walk into the room, but we do encounter Him at every turn. He is in each sunrise that we are privileged to see. He is in the face of everyone we meet, and He is especially present in the Holy Sacraments of the Church. Each Mass we encounter Christ through the Eucharist. Do we sometimes feel like saying "I'll believe it when I see it"? I'm sure we do, but it only means we aren't really looking, because if we are then the proof is there. Is it ok to wonder, ask questions and search for truths? Of course it is. After all, it is part of our human make-up. But if we doubt just like Thomas (who, by the way, sort of gets a bum rap here), are we also willing to go to any length to follow Christ and to protect his legacy and to grow in faith as Thomas did? You see, Thomas only spoke what others were thinking. After all, the others had already seen Christ and they didn't believe it until they had either. It was Thomas who was the first to say "let us also go, that we might die with him" (John :11:16) when Jesus was called to Lazarus 'tomb. He understood that Jesus might need protection. It was also Thomas who asked "Lord, we don't know where you are going. How can we Know the way?" (John: 14 2-4). I'm sure they all were wondering the same thing, but only Thomas had the courage to ask. So let us give credit where credit is due. Thomas wasn't the only "doubter" and he was a very dedicated and loyal follower of Christ, who went on to travel far distances to spread the word of Christ to all nations.

So go ahead, ask questions, search scripture, pray for answers, be curious. But also be open, be brave and follow your convictions. Mostly have faith. That way instead of "seeing is believing", it will be "believing is seeing."

Happy Easter, Alleluia, Alleluia!
