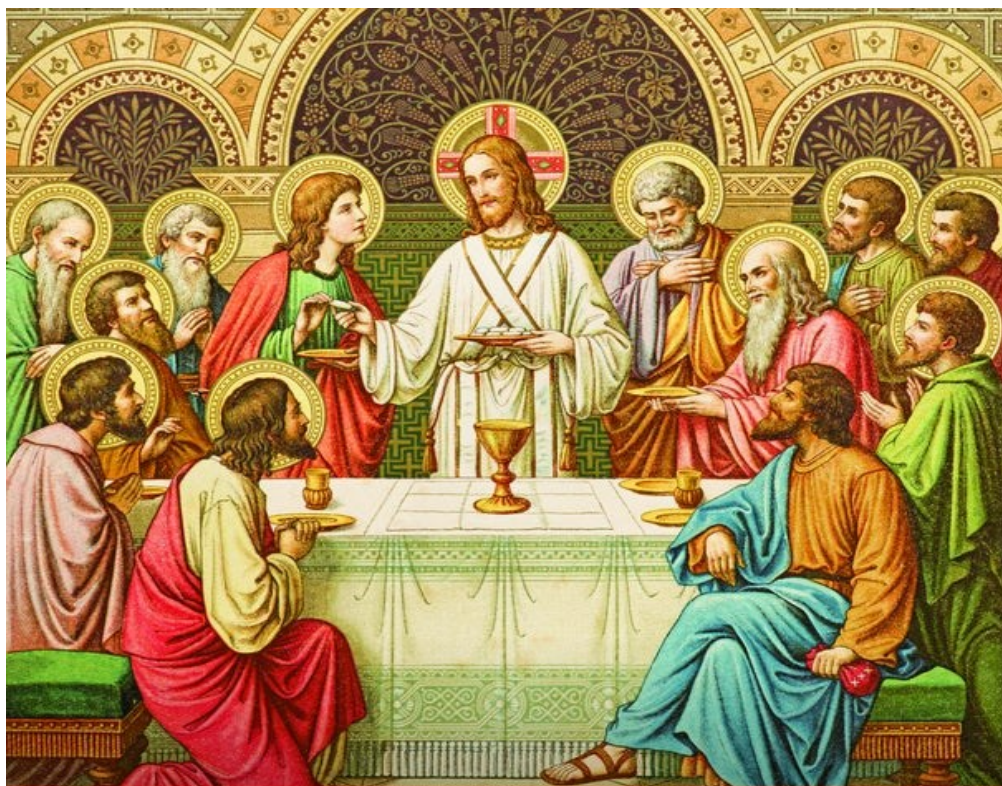

A pre-baptismal class is required for all parents. Baptism preparation classes are held on the second Tuesday of the month for 1st time parents and on the third Tuesday of the month for parents baptizing their second, third...child. Class must be completed 4-6 weeks before the date of the baptism.

Parents are welcome to take the class before their baby is born also. Call the parish office for available dates and to register.

## Marshall's Musings

This weekend, we celebrate the third of three Feasts in a row - Corpus Christi! In Latin, this means the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Since the Roman Catholic Church believes in a doctrine called "Transubstantiation," the Feast is meant to celebrate the literal, real presence of the body of Christ in the blood and wine, present in the consecrated hosts on the altar. The fact that the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ makes good sense, since the Eucharist is the center in the life of the Church.

One of the key liturgical features of Corpus Christi is its procession. Of course, processions have great biblical and liturgical importance. Even in the Old Testament, think of the processions with the Arc of the Covenant or the many accounts of festive processions to Jerusalem - praising God with music and dance. Or in the New Testament, think of the procession of Christ through the first Palm Sunday crowds who shouted his praise. Processions of the faithful enable Christians to give public witness to their faith and give glory to God. This is why we, as the three parishes of Oshkosh unite as one, as we process to Lourdes to proclaim our faith to ALL! See you on Sunday afternoon!

I'm sure that you will agree with me when I say that there is nothing like a full choir loft with an army of worshippers leading our Church in worship. In many churches, this reveals the health of the church. People who are involved in the choir are some of the most committed to the congregation. A choir will attract and influence new people to our Church. A good worship "team" and a great choir is often the leading reason people enjoy your church and want to come back. A full choir loft creates energy in your service and ministers to everyone. We all know that this energy is . . . contagious! There are so many songs with such powerful life changing messages that can only be delivered in music through a dedicated choir.

One of the primary reasons that choirs are so important to Christian worshippers is that they help to create a sense of unity among the congregation. When a choir sings, they are not singing for themselves, but leading the congregation in worship. This creates a sense of community and creates an environment where people feel comfortable expressing their faith with one another. Music has a unique ability to stir the soul, and when combined with powerful lyrics, it can raise the worship experience to a higher level. Choirs provide powerful means of expressing emotion and passion associated with worship. The harmonies, rhythms and melodies sung by the choir, can create a sense of awe and wonder associated with the biblical readings. Choirs can help set the tone for the service, create a sense of order and structure for the service and even provide a framework for the message of the homily to follow. This creates a meaningful worship service for all involved.

Now, let's expand on the word "music" at St. Jude's. Our "music" does not just "happen" at the beginning of the Mass and just "end" when the Mass is finished! A lot of time is spent in preparation by absorbing the biblical readings and studying a lot of music to see how the message of the readings can be reinforced by the music. It is truly

appreciated when someone realizes that the words to the song that we just finished singing had the same words or message that we just heard in the First, Second or Gospel reading just proclaimed. A miracle? No! Now let's add to the preparation time to choose the music and rehearsal time. Not only learning the challenging music, which takes up the majority of the time, but we must learn the meaning of the words being sung, and the story behind the music, so that we can touch someone's spirit and help them have that moment with God!

Extra "Blessings" for us - the "Brass" of St. Jude Parish. We have been so blessed with the addition of brass and other instrumentation throughout the last year. Think of it . . . The 11:00 Mass before Fall Fest began - The choir anthem, "He Never Failed Me Yet" featured our professional drummer, Mark Hable. Our additional proclamation to Christ as King - during our celebration of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we spotlighted trumpets and added our guest violinist, Steve Schani for our choir anthem. And what a Midnight Mass we had in the choir loft at Sacred Heart. We celebrated Christmas with a choir of 36 and 9 brass instrumentalists! Father was surprised that the balcony held all of us. Continuing the Feast of Christmas, we started the New Year by celebrating Epiphany with our choir and brass. Then as we prepared for the Lenten Season we had a Wine and Cheese party featuring the *Bourbon Street Dixieland Band* with vocalist Kris Isham and drummer Mark Hable.

Next came Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday! To make this part of our liturgical year special, we added 6 brass to our choir of 30 members to remind the congregation of the famous story of Holy Week to Easter Sunday. Followed by the Feast of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church and the Holy Spirit descending on all of us, we featured the choir and brass telling the story of Pentecost in our anthem. Finally, last weekend, we celebrated Holy Trinity and Memorial Day. We have a special tradition of having a Veteran bring up a folded flag to an empty table, present the flag, then salute, followed by "Echoing Taps." This is specially written for 2 "echoing" trumpets which touched the hearts of the congregation.

The reason that we work so hard to create beautiful music together is so that we can glorify God and help people experience a holy moment. Besides this weekend at the 9:30 Mass and the following week's 11:00 Mass for Fr. Bill's Anniversary, the choir will finish its season. We are very proud of our music program. Now is the time, that if you meet one of our fine cantors, or one of our dedicated choir members or "any" one of our fine musicians, please take a moment to "thank" them for their devotion of faithful discipleship and for making your spiritual life better by receiving God's Word through music!
