

Bertie's Bits

"Have Faith and Live with Faith" are Jesus' words to Jairus in todays Gospel. So what is Faith?F. fidelity A. acceptance I. intellect T. trust H. hope

We are hearing the Gospel according to Mark (who by the way is my favorite Gospel writer). His writings are like hearing a beautiful story rather than reading like a text book. Also it was the first Gospel written.

Today's story is really two stories in one, and is especially dear to my heart, as it portrays the way I try to live my life (though I often fail) and why I do what I do professionally. That is to live by Faith and Hope and Love, and showing kindness and caring for those in need.

Let's just look at the one part of today's Gospel. That is the saving of a little girl. The twelve year old daughter of Jairus, who is a leading figure in the local synagogue. This gives him much respect and influence in his community. Yet, here we see him bowing down before Jesus (something frowned upon for a Jewish man to do), and he is crying (another thing frowned upon in his community) and begging Jesus to lay hands on his sick daughter so that she might "get well and live". These words are meant for all of us who have lost a loved one. Anyone who has ever sat at the bedside of a very sick child knows the anguish that Jairus is feeling. As Jesus leaves with Jairus to go to his home, someone approaches and tell Jairus his daughter has already died --so to stop bothering Jesus. Now that's about as disrespectful and hurtful as it gets! The pain Jairus felt at hearing of his daughters death is almost unbearable. But Jesus says "Don't be afraid. Just have faith. Just have Faith". Faith in what? That his daughter will be cured? Faith in Jesus? Faith in God? Faith that there is a heaven? Jesus doesn't tell him what to have faith in. he just says "Have faith". This is so true for all of us. We all need to have faith. Faith in God, faith in ourselves, faith in others and faith in the future. Those without any faith are truly sad people. Those who cannot believe in anything anymore are lonely and sad. What should we do about that? Don't be like those in the story! While poor Jairus, whose heart is broken is in a crowd of people, yet nobody in that the crowd reaches out to help him. Human beings need comfort. They need to be cared for and loved. It is what God Made us for. To love. To Love him, love

ourselves and love each other. We are to live with faith. crowd does anything to help him or comfort him. No one except Jesus that is! He says that the girl is not dead, but only asleep. That is because for Jesus there is no death. What we see as the physical death of a loved one Jesus sees as a passage to another life. Those present at the time did not understand this, so Jesus performs a miracle and brings the girl back to physical life and returns her to her parents. Can you even imagine the astonishment for those present? He doesn't stop there, though. His caring for her continues as he then instructs her parents to feed her. His compassion knows no end.

So the crowd that first mocked Jairus, then wailed and cried outside of his house are now jumping for joy at the good news. Sound familiar? We seem to be able to forget what has happened weather it is bad or good as soon as the next thing comes along. But not to those who, like Jairus, are dealing with it all, and not to God who continues to feed us and care for us. To "live with faith" means we don't forget about others. We care for one another as God cares for us. So, do not be afraid. Have and live the faith, for Jesus is with us, as is the Father and the Spirit. Have faith because the Holy Trinity is with us as we walk through life.

- F: fidelity to God our Father
- A: acceptance of what is.
- I: intellect through prayer and scripture
- T: trust in the Trinity
- H: hope in the Resurrection of Jesus
