

The Commissioning- Segways


Who remembers the *Segway*? The Segway was a two-wheeled, self-balancing electric scooter that was made to revolutionize the way we moved from place to place. It was created by Dean Kamen and released in December of 2001. Mr. Kamen had plans to change the world by using less four-wheeled, four-thousand-pound vehicles, which would save the environment and alter the way humanity got around.

Yet, much like many new inventions, there were problems with this new way of mobility. The Segway was rather large and hard to navigate on sidewalks, it was too large to bring into office buildings, and it was an eye sore when stored at

home! The story of the Segway gets better. In Beijing during the 2015 World Athletics Championship, while Usain Bolt (a famous Jamaican runner) was celebrating his victory lap a camera man accidently collided with him and knocked Usain over. In

2003, while in Maine, then President George W. Bush avoided injury after he fell off the vehicle. There were many others who were also had snafus with the Segway. You see, while it may be fun to have new technology there is still much to be said about simply walking... and paying attention to your surroundings!

This weekend Jesus sends his apostles out but not on a Segway, instead he sends them on a walk. This journey they are going on is sandwiched between two major events in Jesus's life. First, he is rejected in Nazareth, "his native place", only after he was insulted and came to the realization that he could not perform miraculous deeds because the people there "lacked faith." The second major event is the death of John the Baptist, a reality and warning about what is to come. Yet, Jesus still instructs them to proceed on this journey. For their journey he gives them authority over evil spirits and does not want them to bring with any attachments that will hold them back.



This story continues today as we preach repentance and the Kingdom of God. We cannot, and should not, stay silent about the opportunity that everyone has to change the world. At St. Jude we find new opportunities or experiences to share time with one another, following the example of being together like the apostles. Going to the Timber Rattler

game in June was less about baseball and more about getting to know one another and who we are outside the brick and mortar walls of the Church. My family was able to visit with another from the parish and we loved learning more about them and their wonderful children. Christian Family Movement (CFM), a ministry that we have here at St. Jude that is now in its 75th year nationally, is dedicated to bringing people together around a table by sharing a meal, laughing and enjoying the company of one another, and looking at how we can assist in the world today. Jesus tells us this weekend not to sit on our hands, not to get too comfortable, and to share with those around us. You don't need a Segway to make it happen. In fact, it may be better if you walk ... or at least safer!


EAA HOTEL





Plastic Free July

Plastic Free July is being celebrated starting July 1 thru July 31 all over the world. Millions of people during that time will be part of the solution to plastic pollution so we can have a cleaner environment. How about St. Jude Parish joining in and choosing to refuse single-use plastic? If we could all join in, think of how much less plastic would be destroying our environment. If all of us started at the smallest level, think what a difference our contribution would make world-wide. There are over 350 million tons of plastic waste generated annually with half being nonrecyclable items like bottles and bags. This all contributes to greenhouse gas emissions. For fun, make it a family activity to find types and amounts of plastic you use at home over a week and then assess which ones are avoidable and which can be replaced with more sustainable alternatives. Switch to re-usable bags instead of plastic. Keep in your car or place near a door so you can remember to take them shopping. Go plastic free in your kitchen. Store leftovers in glass containers. Host a plastic free potluck or picnic. Start a home garden to reduce the need for plastic packaged produce. Even if you have limited space, you can grow herbs, tomatoes, or lettuce in pots. Practice mindful consumption. Do you truly need to make a purchase? See if there's a plastic free alternative. This helps reduce waste and supports a more sustainable lifestyle. Choose to buy from companies that are committed to reduce their environmental impact. Look for products made from recyclable materials packaged in biodegradable or reusable containers and sold by brands with sustainable practices.



MASS INTENTION STIPEND INCREASE

The Diocese of Green Bay is grateful to all those who have generously provided a donation for Masses. The stipend for a Mass Intention has remained the same for over thiry years throughout Wisconsin. The Bishops of the State of Wisconsin gathered and decreed that stipends needed to be adjusted to reflect the current time.

As of July 1, 2024, the stipend for a Mass Intention has increased to \$20. Please know that any stipend money collected goes to the support of the parish, it does not go to the priest directly.
