

Bertie's Bits

"Teaching Have you ever been on a Journey"? I remember taking my grandchildren on vacations and though they were mostly for fun, I would try to teach them things along the way. Things like reading the map and telling me where and when to turn, or reading the historical facts about the region we were going to visit, etc. Well, last week's Gospel tells us that Jesus and His disciples were beginning a journey, one that I like to call this Jesus' teaching journey. Although he has been preaching and teaching for some time now, this time is different. He is not preaching to the crowds of followers - He is teaching his disciples! He is teaching them how to be God-like. In His time as a human being, Jesus strives to show us by example how we are to best serve the Father, by serving those around us.

He begins by telling them that he has come as the Messiah. He tells them he will be handed over to men who will kill him, but that he will rise in three days. Of course, they do not understand this and are most likely frightened by these words. As he is telling them all of this along the way, the disciples are discussing other things (sort of like the grandkid who would be whispering to each other in the back seat on our journeys!). When they come to a place of rest Jesus asks what they were discussing. Uh-oh! Now they must sheepishly admit that they were bantering about which one of them is best. Who is number 1? I, too, have been asked this by my children when they were young and my grandchildren also." Who's your favorite?" Anyone who has been asked this knows that how you answer this is a biggie! Jesus has the best answer though:

"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

Jesus also tells them they must become child-like. Now to us this means becoming more innocent and more inquisitive and more trusting. While all of this is true, in Jesus' time children were not the cherished, catered to little beings that we associate children as today. They were loved, certainly, but their status in the community was little more than servants! They were nurtured until they could be of usefulness, and then even those youngest among the family were expected to pull

their weight. They were second or even third-class citizens. So, when Jesus tells his disciples that they should be more like a child, and he then pulls a child to himself and embraces that child, he is really showing them what He thinks of their concerns about being number 1! He has, in the kindest of ways, put them in their place!

In today's Gospel, Mark is telling us that we are not here to achieve greatness, or to be at the top of the list. Even though doing the best we can is important, what is MOST important is how well we serve others. We must become more attuned to the needs of those around us and how we can be of assistance to them.

Jesus says that "I have come to change the world." And he is asking his disciples and all of us to do the same. For us to change this world which has become so jaded and so "Me, Myself, and I" orientated, we must first -- each and every one of us-- become a servant. We must begin to put the needs of others before our own. Can you **imagine** how the world would look if this was a reality? It would then be the world of our dreams, the world our Father had planned for us.

Imagine!




Coats for Kids - Help a Child. Donate a Coat.
