#### Marshall's Musical Musings

With most of us leading super busy lives, the idea of volunteering - giving your time and energy to a cause without financial reward - may seem an impossible task. I mean, how can we fit anything else into our already busy schedule? Well, the St. Jude Choir is "it" - first and foremost "the" group of dedicated volunteers, committed to meet on a weekly basis to "plow" through new music, revisit older music and finesse hymns and responses. These volunteers are a willing group, ready to make the "unfamiliar" sound easy and accessible to the congregation on Sunday mornings.

Our choir is a patient group which represents varying degrees of musical expertise. Those with many years of singing in the choir can remember when they joined and were a part of the "incoming" new talent. We recognize that singing comes more easily to some than to others, yet we support newer members as they grow musically!

The volunteer choir is a group of caring church members who share the life burdens of other members. Fellowships develop quickly and care is taken to include newer members in activities and prayer. The choir looks out for each other.

Like sports, music involves a team (in this case the choir) and a place and a time to prepare the plan of action. That place and time is the rehearsal and should always be taken seriously. The role of the choir is clear: to convey the message of the word of God through music!

Managing a choir is like managing a business. You need strong leaders and a community of supporters. The main difference between a choir and a business: our workers don't get paid!

A rare and special dynamic is created among those people who don't have to be there. Church choir members show up, week in and week out, out of their love! The only compensation they receive is the joy of being a part of this unique ministry and the joy of making music together. That's enough to keep them coming back!

The members of a volunteer choir seek and find their inspiration in the music they sing and the opportunity they have to be a part of something far greater than the sum of its parts. You can't experience the thrill of an ensemble singing by yourself - the beautiful blend or dynamics of a well rehearsed choir. In a church choir, ordinary people can experience the thrill of a text coming to life as they sing that well rehearsed anthem, hymn or psalm.

A volunteer choir creates a community unlike any other. A choir meets together, week in and week out, they "do life" together. They pray for one another, celebrating births, mourning deaths, welcoming members and grieving the departure of good

friends. A healthy choir is one of the strongest small groups in a congregation.

Love is what makes a volunteer choir: love of music, love for each other and especially the love of the Savior. Love brings a young business man rushing in for rehearsal after a week of conferences in a foreign country. Love inspires a business man to drive several hours through heavy traffic to make a rehearsal for Christmas. Love causes a young couple to rearrange their lives so that the choir rehearsal night becomes "date night" on a weekly basis.

Nothing will ever replace the volunteer church choir. Nothing ever can! Choral music, itself, will never be a thing of the past. If your congregation has a choir, nurture it. Thank the members and support the director. Keep singing - Keep coming! Cherish the joy and the being of this rare and wonderful ministry.

As you (the congregation) are planning to come, celebrate and support our Fall Fest next Sunday, we (the St. Jude Choir) suggests that you come to the 11:00 Mass at Sacred Heart to listen to a special anthem that will get you in the mood to celebrate our tradition of fun and dedication.

The choir and brass will combine the spiritual song, "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot" and the Christian spiritual song, "When the Saints Go Marching In" into an unbelievable anthem which will set your mood for the rest of the day. So after you have heard "Swingin' With the Saints" and you see one of these dedicated "saint" volunteer musicians extend a deserved show of gratitude!
