Bertie's Bits

"Love Makes the World Go Around", "All You Need is Love", "No Greater Love Than This". All songs about love and all make LOVE seem very important! Today Jesus tells us that Love really does make the world go around, and it is all we need and there is nothing greater than having a love so deep as to lay one's life down for someone. When asked about which is the most important commandment that is what Jesus says. We must love God above all else and love our neighbor as ourselves. Notice here, that Jesus sort of lumps these two commandments almost into one. I had to think about why he did that and then the light bulb went on! If we truly love God with "all our heart, all our mind, all our soul and all our strength"- in other words with our entire being, then of course we will love our neighbors. When we love God to our fullest, the cup overflows and therefore spills out on all God has created.

Still, it sounds a bit daunting, doesn't it? To love that completely sounds like it would take a lot of effort. Afterall, I can't spend all day in prayer— how would anything else get done? I mean, we know we should pray each morning and evening. We pray before meals, and we go to Mass. Is that enough? I believe the answer is NO. But don't worry, God knows how busy you are and what you need to get done- and He also knows what you don't need to do! That is what Therese of Lisieux would do. Her "Little Way" was how she showed her great love for God, and it spilled over to all others in her midst. Perhaps just a thought sent His way as you go about your day, a look at the beauty around you and smile up to Him, a kind gesture done for a stranger with a "this one's for you God" in His direction. Just as we show or friends and families that we love them through all the little things we do, so can we love our Heavenly Father in the same way. Doesn't seem so daunting anymore, does it?

We show our love for God and our neighbor by putting God and them first in our lives. Before that TV show we can't miss; before the car we want, before the importance of how much money we make— these things are all ok if we don't turn them into false idols. We must try our best to put God and others first. We won't always succeed because we are human, and our weaknesses get the best of us sometimes. That is when we need to slow down, take stock and be thankful we have such a forgiving Father. Which is the other way we show our love for God— by forgiveness. If God can love us and forgive us our trespasses, aren't we to do the same for others?

So, today, glance up to the sky and smile at God, do some little acts of kindness for someone and if there is someone you need to forgive— give it a try! Then you will be loving God with your whole hearts, your whole soul, your whole mind and all your strength. It really wasn't so hard after all.

My Mother always told me, "God first, people second, and every other thing falls after that." She was a pretty smart lady after all—- and it only took me about 30 years to figure that out!


Prayer Before an Election



UW-Oshkosh FOCUS Missionary Speaker
