





Message from the UW-Oshkosh **FOCUS Missionaries**



The FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) Missionaries are so grateful that we had the opportunity to share about their efforts at the University of Wisconsin - Oshkosh and how you prayerfully and financially support them. As they shared, they are preparing to bring students to SEEK, which is a powerful five-day annual conference in January this year in Salt Lake City, where many students encounter the living person of Jesus. With hopes to bring 55 students and in order to ensure accessibility to their students they are asking for your support for SEEK. Each student's registration costs \$550 so we are fundraising to cover the complete cost of the transportation for all the students in order to not have the registration price increase (we are fundraising \$25,000 to completely cover travel for students). PARISH FARMER'S MARKET RECAP





What do the Advent Candles represent?

First Sunday of Advent: Hope

"Once in our world, a stable had something in it that was bigger than our whole world." - C.S. Lewis

It is only fitting that the first candle on the Advent wreath represents Hope – the first Sunday of Advent not only leads us to anticipate the birth of Christ but celebrate the beginning of a new liturgical season as well. The first candle is purple, the primary color of Advent and a color symbolizing royalty. Sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle," the first candle harkens us back to Isaiah's foretelling of the birth of Christ and all of the promises God gave us in the Old Testament that would be fulfilled by the birth of Jesus.
