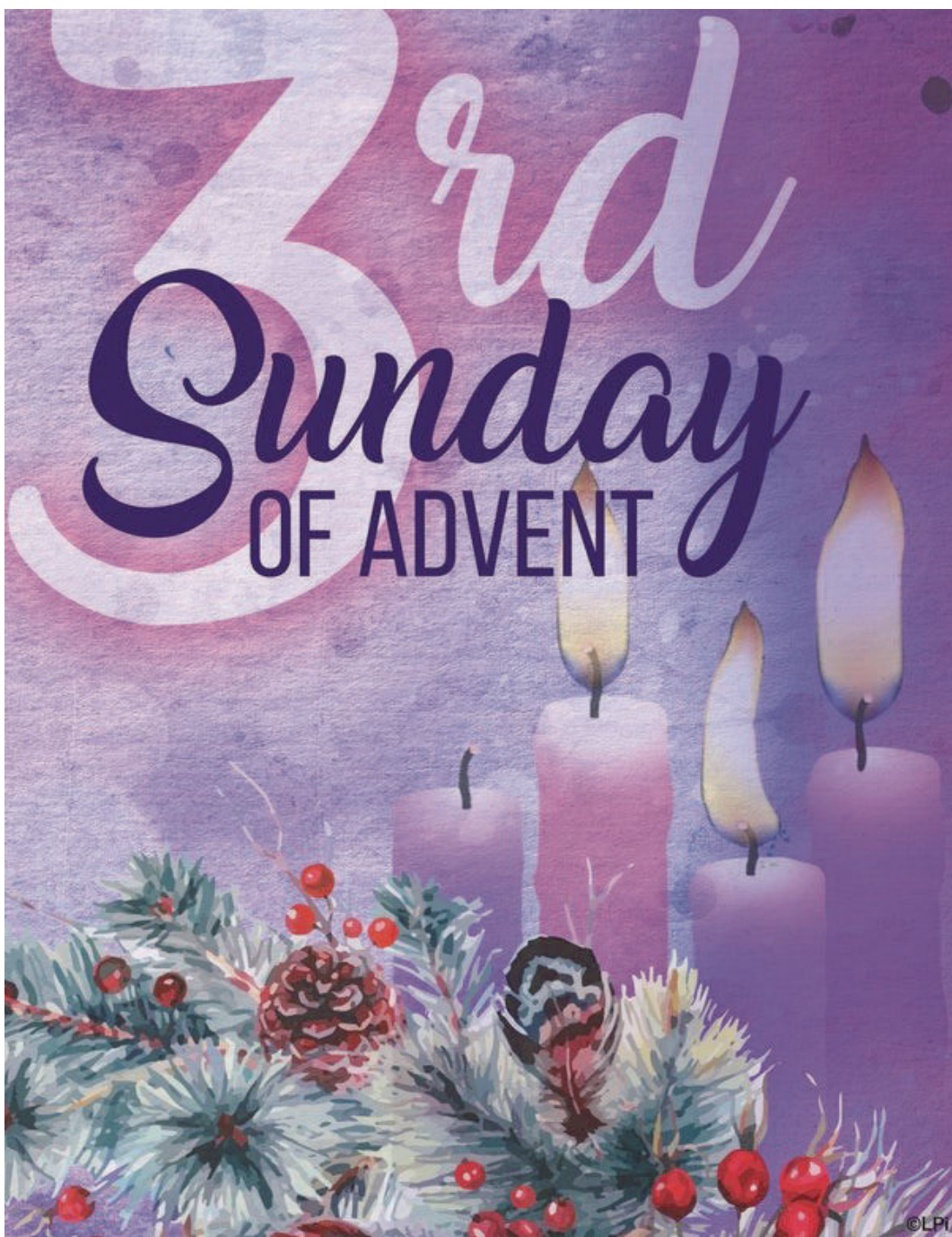

Bertie's Bits

Gaudette (**REJOICE**) Sunday! What does that mean? Well, it means the priest will wear rose colored robes and we will light the rose-colored candle on our Advent wreath. It means there are only 10 days left to open those little windows with candy behind them. It means there are only a few days to finish baking those cookies, trimming that house and buying and wrapping all those gifts! So much to do and so little time! Yes, all of this is true, but what it really means is that we are getting very close to the "JOY" that will be ours as we welcome the Son of Man, as a small baby born to save us from ourselves and from the snares of Satan. A reason to rejoice!

The readings today tell of people who are waiting with much anticipation for their Messiah. In the first reading the Jewish people are still trying to rebuild their home after being held captive in Babylonia for so very long. Anyone who has had to be away from home due to military deployment, or because of other job transfers, first time away at college, or perhaps because of illness, etc. knows the joy of getting back home. When you finally do get home, the familiarity, the traditions, the sights and sounds all flood back in a rush of emotions! So, you can understand in a small way that these people of Israel have much reason to rejoice! Zephaniah even says God will sing joyfully—He is always happy to have us home!

So, why does it seem that so many people now days have a hard time REJOICING? We also don't seem very good at waiting or anticipating good things. We seem to anticipate bad things even when they might not happen, but finding joy seems harder.

Perhaps we are too cluttered. Before Jesus' time it was thought to be selfish and arrogant to own too much. If you had two coats you were to give one away to someone in your family who did not have one. Same with excess food (which meant more than what was needed to thrive). Then when Jesus comes along, He expands this even further to include not only caring for your family members who have less than you, but to **anyone** who has less than you. This is what the Gospel tells us today.

It isn't just physical things we clutter ourselves with. We clutter our time with many "to do" things. We clutter our minds with worries. We clutter our hearts with things we need to forgive. We are just plain cluttered! Jesus knew the importance of quiet and alone time. Time for prayer and time with God. Where is the room for the "joy" in REJOICE in our lives? Where is the anticipation for the Christ child? The

anticipation for the love of this season? How do we go about finding that joy and anticipation? In the second reading Paul says to again **REJOICE-and to do it always**. He says your joy will come from prayers—prayers for ourselves, prayers for others and prayers in thanksgiving to God. He tells us that this is the way to **REJOICE** and rid ourselves of anxiety.

Did you ever notice how happy you feel when you can do something for someone else? How peaceful you feel after prayer? How listening to "Silent Night" makes you warm inside and even misty-eyed. I know I have. So perhaps we only need to heed what we hear in today's messages to be able to find that peace, rid the clutter, and begin to anticipate Christ's Mass. Let's make it a priority to make a batch of REJOICE cookies this year. The recipe for **REJOICE COOKIES** seems pretty easy to follow:

REJOICE COOKIES

1 part repentance
1 part acceptance,
1 part forgiveness
1 part giving
10 parts Love
10 parts Prayer
(5 for the mix & 5 for adding on top)
Mix and set aside.

While that is working its magic, be sure to have plenty of love & prayers left over to sprinkle on top! Bake in the warmth of your heart and then enjoy the fruits of your endeavor. Consume as much as you like –and

REJOICE!

What do the Advent Candles represent?

Third Sunday of Advent: Joy "Gaudete Sunday"

"But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.'"
(Luke 2:10-12)

The third candle of Advent symbolizes Joy. As we continue to approach Christmas Day, our joy grows more and more. The third candle takes us back to the joyful anticipation of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the wise men. On this third Sunday of Advent, which the Church calls "Gaudete Sunday," meaning rejoice or praise, we light the third candle and rejoice like the shepherds. For this reason, the third candle of Advent is called the "Shepherd's Candle," and its color is pink, the liturgical color for joy.

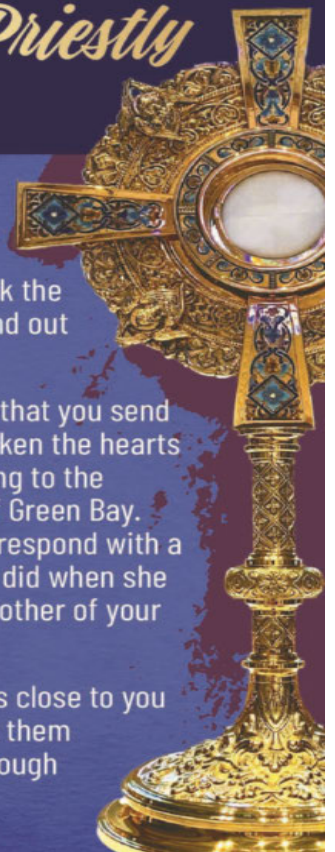
Prayer for Priestly Vocations

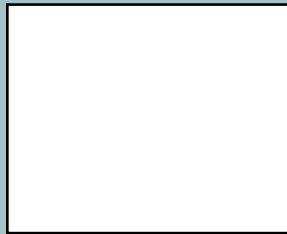
