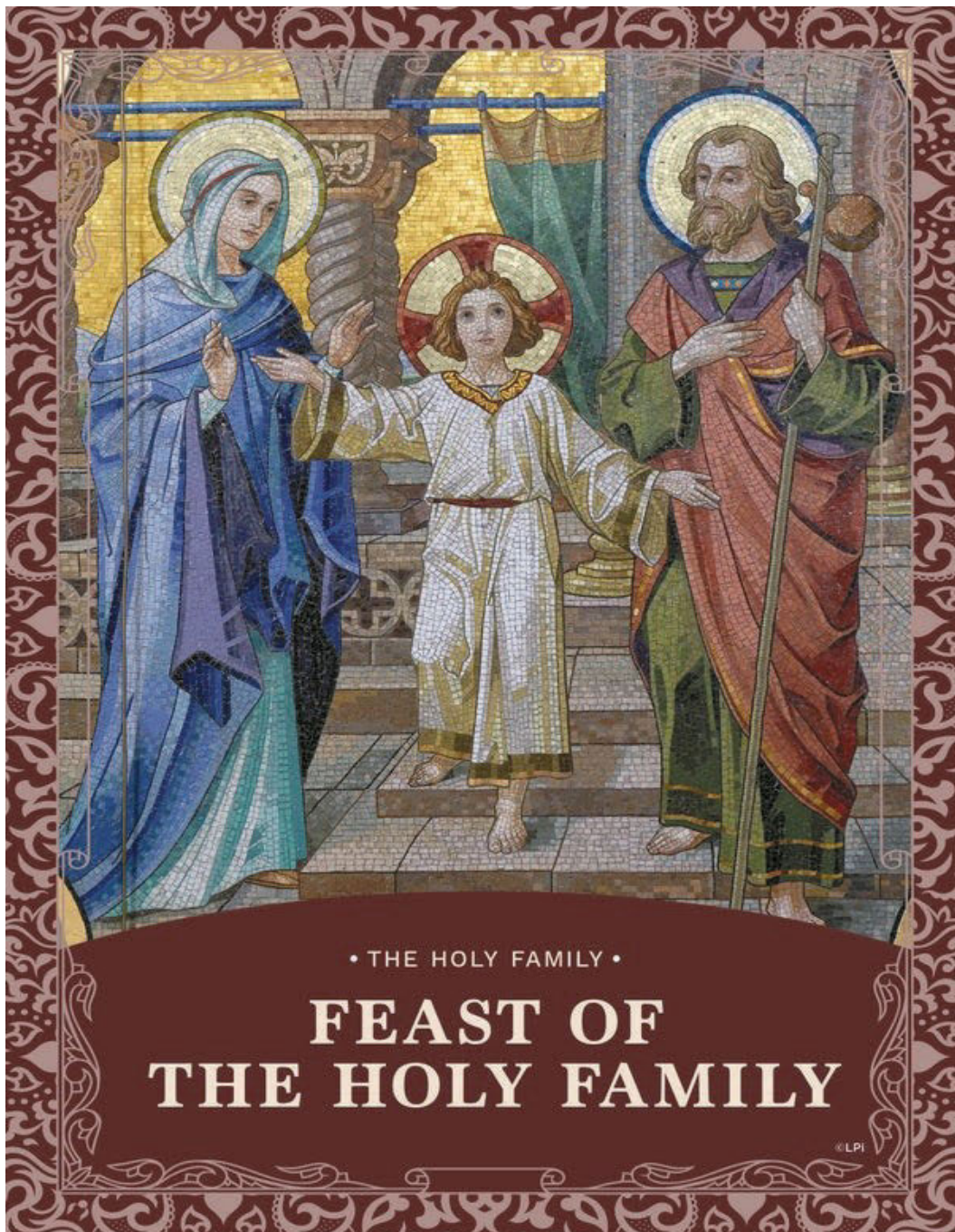

A Normal Family

Way back in the 1900s there was a movie that came out and it became one of the “classic” holiday films, the name was “*Home Alone*.” The premise of the movie is that the family was flying somewhere over the holidays and accidentally left one of their children home... alone. The mom, who was a nervous wreck, was trying everything she could do to get home to spend Christmas with her son, Kevin.

In one particular scene the famous John Candy, who plays a loveable character named Gus, the self-proclaimed “Polka King” of the Midwest, is visiting with her. As they were riding in the back of a moving van (yes, you read that right), he listened to her story and shared that he too left his child accidentally... but he left his son at a funeral

home—over a number of days! The mother was shocked and Gus responded “*Oh, it’s okay, he didn’t talk to us for a while but you know, kids are resilient.*”

There’s a lot to be said about the scene. Sure, it is far fetched but who hasn’t been scared, for even just a moment, when they have lost or couldn’t see their child? That fear that feels like a punch to the stomach and the terrible thought that you may never see your child again. The awful things that your mind tells you that could happen because you aren’t there to protect your child. The Holy Family is feeling this today—and yet, like Gus Polinski, it takes them days before the panic begins to set in. We come to learn a few things about this special family.

First, in the caravan there must have been a large number of people AND that the Holy Family felt

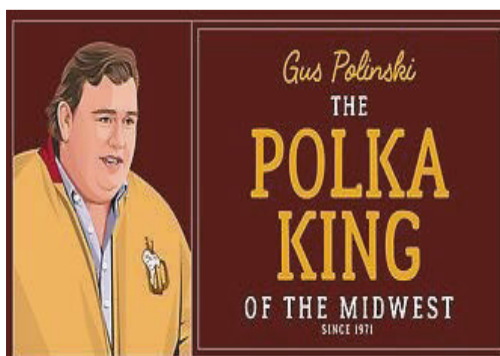
comfortable enough with all of them to allow Jesus to be away from them. Remember, the Angel Gabriel came to Mary and told her that she would give birth to the Son of God... we think Adam and Eve felt foolish in the Garden of Eden - imagine the scene if Mary had to tell God that she lost his Son! But there was a community around them that they trusted.

Second, Jesus was a resilient little fella. Upon Mary and Joseph finding the child Jesus he pretty much tells them, *why are you so worried?* To him it should have been no surprise that he was in his “Father’s” house. Shortly after this we hear Jesus talking about his Father’s house and also learn that he went back with his parents to Nazareth and was “obedient” to them. Sounds a lot like the second reading, doesn’t it?

Third, this is a family who appears to be on a constant journey. The bible shares with us many stories of people being on journey, and most journeys end with some area of their faith being revealed to them. The Magi were on a journey coming to see the baby Jesus, Jesus and his disciples, the apostles after Jesus’s death and resurrection, the list continues.

As we sing Auld Lang Syne on Tuesday night let us remember those who have been in community with us throughout our life. In a special way let us honor our parents and/or parent figures. Be sure to take some time to discern those trips we have taken in which our faith has been revealed to use even more. While you’re at it, listen to a polka!

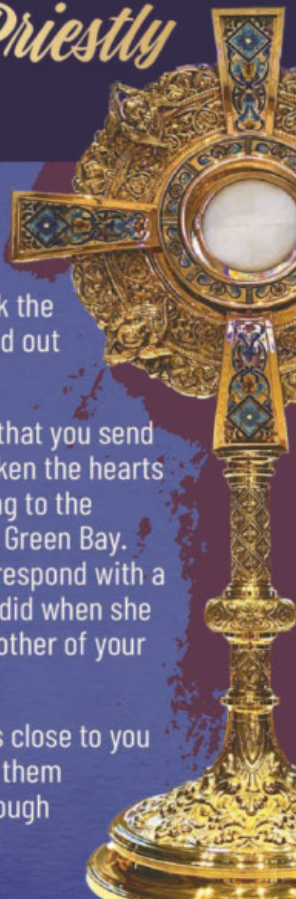
Prayer for Priestly Vocations

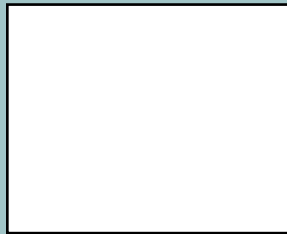
