

Bertie's Bits

Weddings! A time for great celebration and joy. The start of a new phase in someone's life. The look of love and promise in the eyes of the bride and bridegroom. This past 3 years we have had 4 Grandsons get married. Each wedding was unique and very different from each other, but all had one thing in common-- that look of love and the promise of a new chapter in their lives. Such beautiful imagery! There will be trials and problems along the way, but for now joy and love is all they see and it's a good thing. It is this love and commitment and their love of God that will see them through, when it is their time for trials.

To express the love God has for Zion, Isaiah uses this same imagery to show how the land has gone from a desolate, lonely and forsaken land to a place of "Delight" through the love of God. It is the start of a new chapter for Zion. It is the hour. It is Zion's time!

So, too, in today's Gospel, it is a wedding that starts a new chapter in the life of Jesus. Up to now Jesus has preached some, has gathered some disciples and followers, but is still pretty low key. His disciples have really no clue as to who He is and what power is within His grasp. Jesus' Mother holds in her heart the truth of His identity. She understands that He, as the Son of God, can do and be everything if He so chooses.

Many people have a problem with Jesus referring to Mary as "woman" rather than Mother in this passage. They feel it shows disrespect. It does in our time, but not in the time of Jesus. When Jesus lived his earthly life, the customs of that time were very different. All infants, both boys and girls, were raised solely by their mothers until the age of twelve when the boys were then turned over to their fathers and uncles, etc. to be toughened up and to learn the duties of manhood. Because boys were such a special commodity, those first 12 years they were spoiled and coddled by their mothers and a very close bond was formed. It was hard for those boys to distance themselves from that environment, but they must. So, Jesus referring to Mary as "woman" was a result of this distancing. A way to set himself apart and show

his independence. In no way did Jesus disrespect His Mother or love her any less. It was just a matter of the times and customs. So, now, back to the wedding.

Most likely, the Wedding family were relatives of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. If they had not been, it would have been considered very rude of them to interfere in the wine situation! Jesus not only at first was not so keen on the idea of helping because He didn't want to interfere, but also because He said it was not His time yet. But help He did as a favor to the mother he truly loved and to spare the host of the wedding from embarrassment. For Mary's part, she once again showed her true faith by showing the waiters that they were to trust Jesus' word just as she does. So Jesus' first public miracle was performed at a wedding! At a joyful celebration of a couple's newness and the beginning of their new chapter. And, so it was, the beginning of the new chapter in the life of Jesus; for with this sign of turning water to wine, Jesus begins his ministry, and the disciples begin to get a glimpse of and begin to understand who their teacher is. It is his time and theirs to begin living this new chapter.

So, the next time you are invited to a wedding and sit and watch a couple take their vows, try to remember how important Jesus took weddings to be and be prayerful about that new couple as they begin their new chapter. A Holy Sacrament, that you are privileged to witness and take part in.






