Love is in the Air!

We hear a lot about love in this month of February. We had National Marriage week (and wasn't it fun to see all those beautiful wedding photos?) and of course Valentines Day. We even heard a lot about love in scripture this month. But what is love? Is it that funny feeling in the pit of your stomach? Or is it that spark you feel when you see that certain someone? I think it must be more than this. These are just the side effects, if you will. The earthly physical aspects of ourselves. Also, can you really "love" a piece of chocolate? I don't think so!

At least that is not the way Jesus tells us about love. Jesus says that real love is a combination of **Mercy, Forgiveness, Sharing, Giving and even Sacrifice!** Ok, I agree that doesn't sound very romantic, but that's the point. Real love isn't that romantic. Real love, like the kind given to us by God the Father is all those things. His Mercy and forgiveness that is given to us sure isn't because we are so deserving. It is because he loves us. His giving goes up and beyond anything we mortals could even conceive. Crayon Recycling Drive


The Caring for God's Creation committee is excited to announce we will be sponsoring a crayon recycling drive.





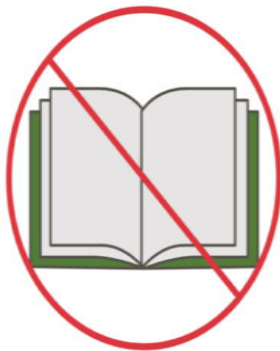

FEBRUARY 12 SYAH POTLUCK



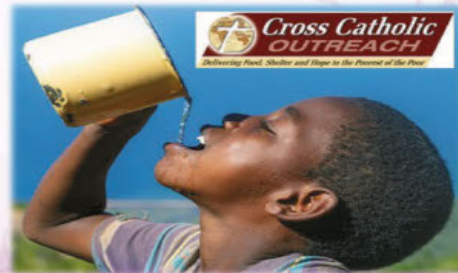

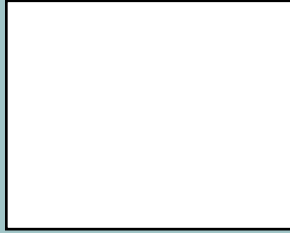

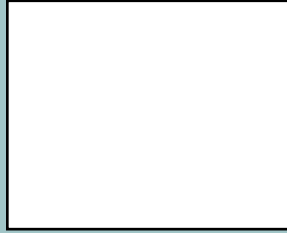
