

# The Fig Tree

We with tend to struggle issues surrounding sudden loss or tragic events, don't we? How often have we said to ourselves or one another "How could this happen to such a good person?" or "Why does God allow this?" We will never fully understand why bad things happen because we feel the emptiness that is left behind, a void. This weekend we hear that it has been explained to us, at least a little bit.

In the beginning of the Gospel those around Jesus are trying to explain to HIM that suffering happens only to those who deserve it (ironic right, they are trying to

explain something to the Son of God!). Can you imagine how frustrated Jesus must have felt hearing this? Instead of showing his frustration he comes at it from a different angle.

Jesus, the wonderful story teller and catcher of

imaginations, always uses vivid imagery and relevant scenarios that related to where people are at that moment in time. Today is no different! The tower of Siloam falling was something that happened in the time of those whom he was speaking to. If you recall the healing of the paraplegic by Jesus, that pool was next to the tower of Siloam, in fact it was called the *Pool of Siloam* which was within the *City of David*. This was an important event to those he is speaking to.

# This story:

- shows that tragedy is not tied to specific people who we think may "deserve" it more than others.
- shows that death is random and not a decision by God to inflict upon us.
- is so recent that those hearing the story knew exactly what he was talking about.
- 4) is a great opportunity for Jesus to be able to explain the urgency of repenting because our lives could be cut short at any moment.

After this, Jesus talks about the fig tree—yet another opportunity to explain that even

when we think something good will not from something come that is considered bad, it still can. It takes dedication, takes it commitment, takes it love.

In this season of Lent we talk much about

repenting from our sins, forgiving those who need to be forgiven and asking for forgiveness to those who we have hurt or done some injustice to. This season offers us the opportunity to clean our soul so that, when the time comes for us to leave our mortal life behind, we can do so knowing that we are prepared. It takes dedication—it takes commitment—it takes love.



# Dear Parishioners,

The Ministry of Holy Communion to the homebound is an important and beautiful ministry of the Church. This Ministry allows us to maintain that connection between Christ, the Church, and our local Parish Community. Recently, Bishop Ricken asked all the parishes across the diocese of Green Bay to review how this is done and to follow the norms and guidelines that he has developed. We are in the process of doing that at St. Jude. To help us move forward in this process, please pay attention to the following:

- Please let us know if you are currently bringing communion to an individual family member (e.g., a spouse, a parent, a family member, a parishioner, a friend, etc.). It's important to let us know your name, to who you bring Communion, and whether you do so regularly or occasionally.
- Please send an email to balbright@stjudeoshkosh.org. This email belongs to Bertie Albright, the parish Care Ministry Coordinator. You may also contact her at the parish office by phone or in person to let her know.
- If a family member is not trained and commissioned as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, we will need to ask that they be trained if they continue to serve in this way.
- For those who serve on our parish care ministry team, we will contact you as time goes on with updates on how we perform specific ministry tasks.

Thank you, and I look forward to your cooperation in this effort.

# Bringing Communion to the Homebound/Sick

Following Bishop David Ricken's pastoral letter and the document: "Norms and Guidelines for the Diocesan Practice of Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion," sent to us on 2/5/2025, and also following "The directives in Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside Mass," we inform you of a few changes in the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion at our parish.

- Starting the Weekend of March 22-23, 2025, we will no longer distribute communion to the homebound in the communion line at Mass.
- Anyone coming forward in the communion line with a pyx will be asked to speak with the priest or deacon after the Mass.
- The distribution of the Holy Communion to the Extraordinary Ministers and Care Ministers of the sick and homebound will be done immediately after the conclusion of each Mass.
- Unless the person has their own pyx, we will provide them a pyx and a burse to bring holy communion.
- Immediately after each Mass, the deacon or priest will go to the area near the credence table in the sanctuary to distribute the Eucharist for the sick/ homebound.
- Initially, we will confirm that the person is a currently trained Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion or Care Minister on the parish list and ask who is receiving communion.
- The pastor and Care Ministry Coordinator need to know this information to better care for and coordinate this ministry for the sick and the homebound on a regular basis.
- A clipboard will be available in the church to write this information down. This way, we can keep a record of the ministers and recipients with the Care Ministry Coordinator.
- Please return both Pyx and burse, if they belong to the church, the next time you come to church.
   They may return them in the basket in the sacristy, where they will stay until purified.
- No parishioner or family member is to bring Holy Communion to the sick or homebound unless they are commissioned Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion or Care Ministers.






