

Marshall's Musings

"Let the one among you who is without sin to be the first to throw a stone at her"

In the Gospel of John, we find a powerful lesson of forgiveness and the nature of sin in the words of Jesus. This verse occurs during the story of the woman caught in the act of adultery, where the religious leaders brought before Jesus, accusing her her and questioning how she should be punished, according to the Law of Moses. This particular statement from Jesus challenges the accusers to reflect in their own lives and their own sins, before making judgments about another person.

The meaning behind this verse emphasizes the importance of self examination and humility. Each of us has imperfections and sins, and in these moments of judgment against others, we are reminded to look inward instead of outward. The response from Jesus, not only provides a call for mercy, but also a reminder that everyone, regardless actions. deserves of their compassion and understanding. The message here, urges us to approach others with grace rather than judgment, as we all have our own battles with sin in our own life.

What is so powerful is what Jesus had to say about casting judgment then, still speaks loud and clear today. As if we are standing with the Pharisees, stone in hand, facing our own weaknesses When Jesus criticizes the Pharisees with his instruction, he is clearly indicating that God sees our sin. Jesus knew their sinful motive was to discredit his authority, not to bring any kind of justice, and yes, the law did state that adultery was a sin punishable by the death of the man and the woman. The fact that the man was not also brought to trial, along with the woman, exposes their sinful hearts. And because they cannot say they are eye witnesses, as the law requires, Jesus is not violating the law in letting her go without condemnation. In other

words, Jesus had not committed the sins of lying about the incident, conspiring to discredit God, or call for the execution without a fair number of eyewitnesses or both of the people accused. Only the sinless can judge rightly in this instance, and that is what Jesus does.

This story is both frightening and freeing, in that it gives us a close-up look at Jesus' heart. He knows we sin. He'll show them to us, if we are willing, and he invites us to the freedom of leaving our sin patterns behind to follow Him.

So in summary, Jesus upheld justice by affirming the woman's guilt and not contradicting God's law regarding adultery. Yet, he extended mercy to the woman by preventing her condemnation by sinful men. His memorable statement, powerfully illustrates that only a sinless person has the right to pass ultimate judgement on others. Since no one meets that criteria, except Christ, we need to show grace and humility, rather than being quick to condemn others.

Finally, in case you want to know, the Hallelujah Chorus from Handel's Messiah debuted in the spring holiday season of the mid 1700's and is used to proclaim the resurrection of Jesus. The word "Hallelujah" means "praise to God" or "Praise to the Lord!" This is a fitting expression of joy and triumph of the resurrection.

Would you believe that "your" St. Jude Choir is singing the Hallelujah Chorus on Holy Saturday night and Easter Sunday morning! We invite all of you to rejoice with us!!!






